

# **ASRC LARGE ANIMAL UNIT F GUIDELINES**

- 1. Protocol number, name of primary investigator, and names of personnel working with the animals should be written on the white board located at the front of the respective unit. Work and home phone numbers for each individual should be included. Each animal should be identified in its appropriate pen, stall, etc. Identity of animals is to be kept current.**
- 2. All bagged feed will be stored in the feed room on pallets at least six inches from the wall. Open bags must be stored in garbage cans with a tight lid. Bulk feed will be stored in bins and covered at all times. The feed room should be cleaned daily. Clean up all spills immediately.**
- 3. Each bag and container of feed must be dated.**
- 4. Cleaning (hosing down) of the animal pens and floors will be completed before 9 a.m. and after 3 p.m. daily. Waste pits in AM119 and 120 must be flushed twice a day (*minimum*) after the pen cleaning using the flush tanks in AM119. Basement collection room below AM124 must be cleaned daily and the pit flushed (using the flush tank) when animals are housed above.**
- 5. Wash down the loading dock and any hallways you used to move animals in or out of the building.**
- 6. At completion of experiments, all surfaces (pens, feeders, walls and overhead pipes) will be thoroughly cleaned and sanitized. Do NOT use pressure washer on walls or overhead pipes of Unit F animal rooms. Use regular hose with soap and brush as necessary. All feed is to be removed from the feed room. Cleaning must be completed within 24 hours after animals are removed. Thereafter, charges will continue until cleaning is completed at a rate of \$50 per day.**
